

Sizewell C Community Fund Scoring Matrix

Your application will be assessed and scored against the priority criteria for the Sizewell C Community Fund. Your application will be scored between 0 and 4 for each priority criteria. Some criteria are weighted as they are high priority. The more closely you meet these criteria, the more chance your application will have of being successful.

Example: The location of the project has a weighting of 4. If your application scores 3 for this criteria (which indicates it is close to an area of Sizewell C activity) then this will be multiplied by 4 resulting in a total score of 12 for 'Location of Project'.
